Albury Street	DEAGON	It appears as DEAGON Street in a 1919 street directory but it has become Albury Street in a 1931 street directory. Not to be confused with DEAGON Street, Sandgate (see below); indeed, maybe that was the reason for its renaming. The earliest newspaper reference found to Albury Street is in 1929. [source TROVE]
Alfred Street	SHORNCLIFFE	Previously called Charles Street It appears to have been Charles until 1882 then Alfred Street then renamed to Bevington Street in 1938 when many other Alfred Streets were renamed.
Allpass Parade	SHORNCLIFFE	In a 1919 street directory, the south-west section of the current Allpass Parade (from Jetty Street to Friday Street) is called Wharf Terrace, while the north-east section from Jetty Street to Shorncliffe Parade is called South End. In a 1931 street directory, both have been replaced with <u>Allpass Parade</u> .
Ann street	SANDGATE	Renamed Towner Street.
Apperley Street	BANYO	<i>Previously Third Avenue. Renamed in 1938 and confirmed by comparison of the 1938 and 1948 street directories.</i>
Ardill Street	ZILLMERE	Renamed in 1938 and confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Ashford Street	SHORNCLIFFE	Previously called William Street. Renamed in 1938 [source][source] and confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Bamford Street	SANDGATE	Previously called Short Street or also Syre Street. Renamed in 1938 and confirmed by comparison of the 1938 and 1948 street directories. Not to be confused with another Short Street in Sandgate (see immediately above) nor the Short Street in Deagon.
Barclay Street	DEAGON	Previously Main Street. Both Barclay Street and Bridge Street were originally called Main Street at some time prior to 1939 [source]. A 1931 street directory shows Bridge Street just as it is today. However, Barclay Street acquired its new name between 1938 and 1948 (based on street directories). A 1917 street directory lists only Main Street (and not Bridge Street) in its index and its map shows Main Street as forking. The position of the railway line suggests to me that the original Main Street was a straight road that was "bent" to accommodate the railway line and that the segment of the old Main Street that was cut off by the railway line was probably renamed Bridge Street at some later time. The new "bent" Main Street was then renamed Barclay Street in 1938. Can anyone confirm this?
Baskerville St	BRIGHTON	Previously called Government Road South
Beatham Street	SANDGATE	Previously called Maud/Maude Street Renamed prior to 1939 and confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Benjamin Street	SANDGATE	Originally off Curlew Street but was subsumed into Curlew Park along with White Street.
Bevington Street	SANDGATE	Previously called Charles until 1882 then renamed Alfred Street. Name had changed by 1939 so probably one of the 11 Alfred Streets renamed in 1938. Source TROVE
Bevington Street	SHORNCLIFFE	Alfred Street was Charles Street until 1882 then became Bevington in 1938. Name had changed by 1939 so probably one of the 11 Alfred Streets renamed in 1938.
Bishopsgate Road	BANYO	<i>The streets in this area have been replaced by large industrial estates. Bishopsgate Road ran from Blinzinger Road (which went through to Earnshaw Road at that time) to Tufnell Road. Information derived from an 1884 map.</i>

Blinzinger Road	BANYO	<i>Blinzinger Road used to extend across the railway line through to Northgate Road (now Earnshaw Road), but part of it disappeared under the Golden Circle Cannery. The disconnected section of Blinzinger Road from Northgate Road (now Earnshaw Road) to Nudgee Road is still shown on a 1956 map as Blinzinger Street, but its name on current maps is Crockford Street</i>
Borella Street	SANDGATE	Previously called Edward Street. Too many Edward Streets in Brisbane. In 1938, it was renamed Borella Street according to these [source][source] and this is confirmed by a 1938 map showing it as Edward Street and a 1948 map showing it as Borella Street. This [source] claims Edward Street in Nashville was renamed Jennings Street in 1938 but there are no maps showing this street as Jennings Street.
Botts Road	SANDGATE	Renamed see Brighton Road Sandgate
Bridge St	DEAGON	Previously called Main Street
Brierly Street	GEEBUNG	<i>Renamed in 1938, source TROVE, and confirmed by comparison of 1938 street directory and current maps (the 1948 street directory doesn't show that area clearly).</i>
Brighton Rd	SANDGATE	Previously called Bott Street In 1913 the council decided to combine part of Deagon Street and Botts Road to create Brighton Road. [source] It is not indicated which part of the current Brighton Road was formerly Deagon Street and which part was Botts Road, but looking at the angle that the current Deagon Road connects into Brighton Road, it seems most likely that the southern section of Brighton Road (from the current Deagon Street to Seymour Street) was originally Deagon Street, while the northern section of Brighton Road (from the current Deagon Street to Ward Street) was originally Botts Road.
Brighton Road	SANDGATE	Previously called Deagon Street Sandgate. In 1913 the council decided to combine part of Deagon Street and Botts Road to create Brighton Road. [source] It is not indicated which part of the current Brighton Road was formerly Deagon Street and which part was Botts Road, but looking at the angle that the current Deagon Road connects into Brighton Road, it seems most likely that the southern section of Brighton Road (from the current Deagon Street to Seymour Street) was originally Deagon Street, while the northern section of Brighton Road (from the current Deagon Street to Ward Street) was originally Botts Road. Not to be confused with Deagon Street, Deagon.
Brighton Road	SANDGATE	Lagoon Street?
Bungama St	DEAGON	Sandgate Street or as Sandgate Avenue on Realestate estate sales maps. It appears as Sandgate Street in the 1948 street directory and Bungama Street in the 1956 street directory
Cannon Avenue/Row	BANYO	<i>This area is now an industrial estate.</i>
Charles Street	DEAGON	Renamed Loftus Street Deagon
Charles Street	ZILLMERE	Renamed Ewing Street in 1938
Chubb Street	SANDGATE	Previously called Mary Street. Renamed in 1938. This is confirmed by finding it as Mary Street in a 1917 street directory but as Chubb Street in 1948.
Church Street	BANYO	<i>Renamed Nesbit Street. Unfortunately there is no Nesbitt Street on a contemporary map as the Golden Circle Cannery was built over it.</i>
Cooksley Street	SANDGATE	Renamed Third Avenue.
Coward's Island	SANDGATE	Situated at the end of Curlew St also known as Loudon's Is. Not in evidence now
Creek Street	DEAGON	Renamed Lendon Street before 1939

Creek Street	SHORNCLIFFE	Previously called Garden Lane Later to becom Palm Avenue about 1901
Cribb Parade	CRIBB ISLAND	Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
Croydon Street	BANYO	<i>This area is now an industrial estate.</i>
Darling Street	SANDGATE	Previously called George Street. Renamed in 1938 Confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.
David Street	CRIBB ISLAND	Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
Deagon Island	SANDGATE	At the creek end of Palm Avenue. Not obvious now.
Deagon Street	DEAGON	Renamed Albury Street. It appears as DEAGON Street in a 1919 street directory but it has become Albury Street in a 1931 street directory. Not to be confused with DEAGON Street, Sandgate (see below); indeed, maybe that was the reason for its renaming. The earliest newspaper reference found to Albury Street is in 1929. (source TROVE)
Derrils La	SANDGATE	Or Derryl's Lane. May have been part of the old Main Street
Douglas St	BRIGHTON	Previously part of Government Road Southwest From Baskerville St to Lascelles Street
Eagle Tce	SANDGATE	Section from Shillam Way to previously Upper Esplanade.
Eagle Tce	SHORNCLIFFE	Hogan Terrace Upper Esplanade See Park Parade and Hogan Terrace
Eames Street	BANYO	<i>Previously First Avenue Banyo. Too many First Avenues in Brisbane. Renamed 1938 and confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories. (See also First Street, Banvo, below)</i>
Edward Street	BANYO	<i>Renamed Langton Street</i>
Edward Street	SANDGATE	Renamed Borella Street Sandgate
Edward Street	ZILLMERE	Renamed Lovegrove Street.
Eighteenth Av	BRIGHTON	Renamed Regent Street
Eighth Avenue	SANDGATE	Bloomfield Lane
Eleventh Av	BRIGHTON	Renamed Eleventh Avenue from Flinders Pde to the right angled bend .  The remainder, from the bend to 12th Avenue, is Still Dickson St
Elmslie Street (gone)	CRIBB ISLAND	Renamed in 1938 Confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories. Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island was subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
Emily St	DEAGON	See also Wimble Street.
Esplanade	CRIBB ISLAND	Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
Ewing Street	ZILLMERE	Previously Charles Street, Renamed in 1938. [source] The name change has occurred by 1939
Fifteenth Av	BRIGHTON	Renamed Fifteenth avenue from Flinders Parade to Brighton Terrace. The section from Brighton Terrace to Queens Parade remains Townsend Street.
Fifth Av	SANDGATE	Previously Slaughter Street. In 1913 Petty, Wilson, Cooksley, Jane, Slaughter, Henry and Tully were renamed First, Second, Third, Fourth Fifth . Sixth and Seventh Avenues respectively.
Fifth Avenue	CRIBB ISLAND	Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
First Av	SANDGATE	Previously Petty Street 1913 Petty, Wilson, Cooksley, Jane, Slaughter, Henry and Tully were renamed First, Second, Third, Fourth Fifth , Sixth and Seventh Avenues respectively.

First Avenue	BANYO	<i>Renamed Eames Street. Not to be confused with First STREET below.</i>
First Avenue	BOONDALL	<i>Renamed Peacock Street.</i>
First Avenue	CRIBB ISLAND	Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
First Avenue	ZILLMERE	Renamed Rowell Street
First Street	BANYO	<i>Renamed Gold Street. Not to be confused with First Avenue above</i>
Flinders Pde	SANDGATE	Lower Esplanade See Upper Esplanade
Fourteenth Av	BRIGHTON	Previously Hardgrave Street
Fourth Av	SANDGATE	Previously Jane Street In 1913, the council decided to rename Petty, Wilson, Cooksley, Jane, Slaughter Henry, and Tully streets to be First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth Sixth and Seventh Avenues respectively.
Fourth Avenue	ZILLMERE	Renamed Ardill Street
Fourth Street	CRIBB ISLAND	Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
Froude Street (north-west segment)	BANYO	<i>Previously called Sturt Street. An 1884 map shows Collard Place commencing at the intersection of Musgrave Street and Station Street (now Kennaway Street) and continuing north-east parallel with the railway line. Sturt Street is shown as commencing at Collard Place and heading north-west. Looking at a 1926 street directory, the short north-east segment of Victoria Street appears to be the start of Collard Place and the north-west segment of Victoria Street appears to be Sturt Street. The remainder of Collard Place (further to the north-east) does not appear in the 1926 street directory. Victoria Street appears in a 1956 street directory but in a 1975 street directory, it has been renamed to its current name Froude Street.</i>
Fulham Street	SANDGATE	Charles Street One of 11 Charles Streets renamed in 1938. See Bevington Street
Garden Lane	SHORNCLIFFE	Renamed Creek Street then became Palm Avenue.
George Street	SANDGATE	Renamed Darling Street Sandgate.
Gillies Street	ZILLMERE	Previously called William Street. Renamed in 1938 (source TROVE) and confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories. Note at this time William/Gillies Street commenced at Muller Street and went west, intersecting with Beckman Street, and then went west for another approx 200 metres as a cul de sac. In the 1956 street directory Gillies Street has come further west but still ends in a cul de sac (almost but not quite intersecting with Church Street) and Yukon Street and Saxby Streets have been created and intersect with Gillies Street. The connection through to Church Street must have occurred after 1956.
Gladstone St	BRIGHTON	Previously Bay Crescent. It was renamed Gladstone St from Brighton Tce to intersection with Speight St and Twelfth Avenue from Brighton Tce to Flinders Pde The remainder from Speight St to Baskerville Street became Paul St.
Gold Street	BANYO	<i>An 1884 map shows it as First Street. By 1926, a street directory shows it as Gold Street. (See also First Avenue, Banyo)</i>
Gordon St	BRIGHTON	Previously Park Villa Road
Government Road Centre	BRIGHTON	Renamed Nathan St
Government Road Centre	BRIGHTON	Renamed Nathan St
Government Road North	BRIGHTON	Renamed Queens Parade

Government Road Northeast	BRIGHTON	Renamed Townsend St to Brighton Terrace then Fifteenth Avenue to Flinders Parade
Government Road South	BRIGHTON	Renamed Baskerville St
Government Road Southwest	BRIGHTON	Renamed Douglas St from Baskerville St to Lascelles St
Grays Road	LOWER NUDGE	Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
Green Road	LOWER NUDGE	(Click here for Wikipedia Cribb Island information.) Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
Hayden Street	NUDGE	Renamed in 1938 and confirmed by comparison of the 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Henry Street	SANDGATE	Renamed Sixth Avenue.
Higgins Street (gone)	CRIBB ISLAND	Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
Higgins Street (gone)	CRIBB ISLAND	Previously called John Street. One of the John Street's renamed in 1938 . Higgins Street appears in the 1948 street directory, but unfortunately the earlier additions don't have maps for Cribb Island to confirm that it was original John Street. Cribb Island no longer exists as a suburb as it was resumed for Brisbane Airport.
Holroyd Street	BOONDALL	Previously called Second Avenue. There were too many Second Avenues in Brisbane. Renamed in 1938 [source][source] and supported by comparison of 1938 (index but no map) and 1948 street directories.
Innes Street	GEEBUNG	Renamed in 1938 . This area is not covered by the 1938 street directory maps so I cannot confirm it was previously Short Stret, but in index of the the 1948 street directory, there is the entry "Innes Street, Geebung (late Station Street) ".
Jane Street	SANDGATE	Renamed Fourth Avenue
Jennings Street	ZILLMERE	Previously called Jane Street. One of the Jane Streets renamed in 1938 . Confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Junction Street	BANYO	This area is now an industrial estate.
Kate St	SHORNCLIFFE	Lower Kate Street (from Barton Street to Friday Street) appears on an 1919 street map but in a 1931 street directory it is simply known as Kate Street. Presumably the "lower" became redundant after the more upper part of Kate Street (from Friday Street to Sunday Street, now Park Parade) was renamed Pier Avenue in 1913.
Kennaway Street	BANYO	Previously called Station Street. Renamed in 1938 and confirmed by comparison of the 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Kennerley St	SANDGATE	James Street One of the 16 James Streets renamed in 1938 . Confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Kennerley Street	SANDGATE	Previously called James Street. One of the 16 James Streets renamed in 1938 . Confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Knox Street	SANDGATE	John Street One of the John Street's renamed in 1938 and confirmed by comparison of the 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Knox Street	SANDGATE	Previously called John Street. One of the John Street's renamed in 1938 and confirmed by comparison of the 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Langton Street	BANYO	Previously Edward Street. There were too many Edward Streets in Brisbane. Renamed 1938 and confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.

Lascelles St	BRIGHTON	Previously Government Road West
Lendon Street	DEAGON	Previously Creek Street. Renamed before 1939 ; probably one of the 14 Creek Streets in Brisbane that were renamed in 1938 . This is confirmed as it appears as Creek Street in a 1938 map and as Lendon Street in a 1948 map.
Loftus St	DEAGON	Previously Charles Street Comparison of 1934 and 1941 electoral rolls show that Charles Street has been renamed Loftus Street, probably one of the 11 Charles Streets in Brisbane which were renamed in 1938.
Longstaff St	BRIGHTON	Previously Queen Street Renamed in 1938 and confirmed by comparison of the 1938 and 1948 street directory.
Lovegrove Street	ZILLMERE	Previously called Edward Street. Too many Edward Streets in Brisbane. Renamed 1938 [source][source] and confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Lower Kate Street	SHORNCLIFFE	Renamed Kate Street. Lower Kate Street (from Barton Street to Friday Street) appears on an 1919 street map but in a 1931 street directory it is simply known as Kate Street. Presumably the "lower" became redundant after the more upper part of Kate Street (from Friday Street to Sunday Street, now Park Parade) was renamed Pier Avenue in 1913.
Main Street	DEAGON	Renamed Barclay Street and the northern end renamed Bridge Street.
Margaret Street	BANYO	<i>Renamed Meredith Street.</i>
Mary Street	BALD HILLS	Renamed Windeyer Street.???
Mary Street	GEEBUNG	<i>Renamed Briery Street.</i>
Mary Street	SANDGATE	Renamed Chubb Street.
Maude Street	SANDGATE	Or Maud Street. Renamed Betham Street Sandgate
Meredith Street	BANYO	<i>Previously Margaret Street. There were too many Margaret Streets. Renamed 1938 [source][source] and confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.</i>
Meymot Street	BANYO	<i>This 1884 map shows it as Second Street (not to be confused with a separate Second Avenue). By 1926, a street directory shows it as King Street. It was one of the 14 King Street's renamed in 1938 [source][source] and confirmed by comparison of the 1938 and 1948 street directories.</i>
Morton Street	CRIBB ISLAND	Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
Murray St	SANDGATE	Previously Granville Street See Lilley Estate Div Plan
Musgrave Road	BANYO	<i>May have been called Musgrave Street. Not clear if this is an official name change.</i>
Nathan St	BRIGHTON	Previously Government Road Centre See also King St (Old name) <b>brighton</b> See also Government Road Centre
Nesbit Street	BANYO	<i>Originally called Church Street, but there were too many Church Streets so it was renamed Nesbitt Street in 1938. [source] Unfortunately there is no Nesbitt Street on a contemporary map as the Golden Circle Cannery was built over it. See this 1884 [map] (note, North is downwards).</i>
Ninth Av	SANDGATE	Previously part of Wakefield Street From Flinders Parade to Brighton Terrace. The section from Brighton Terrace to Baskerville Street is still Wakefield Street.
Northcote St	BRIGHTON	Previously Sackville Street
Palm Av	SHORNCLIFFE	Previously Garden Lane Then Creek Street until 1882 then renamed Palm Avenue.

Park Parade	SHORNCLIFFE	Previously part of Sunday Street. In a 1917 street directory, Sunday Street connects from Signal Row down to South End (now Allpass Parade). But in a 1931 street directory, the section from Signal Row to Swan Street has been renamed Park Parade and Sunday Street is reduced to Swan Street down to Allpass Parade. However, newspapers references to Park Parade can be found as early as 1902.
Paul St	BRIGHTON	Previously Bay Crescent The part from Flinders Pde to Brighton Terrace became Twelfth Avenue, the part from Brighton Tce to Speight St became Gladstone St and the remainder Paul St
Peacock Street	BOONDALL	Previously First Avenue Boondall. Too many First Avenues in Brisbane. Renamed 1938 [source][source] and supported by comparison of 1938 street directory (index entry but no map) and 1948 street directory.
Petty Street	SANDGATE	Renamed First Avenue.
Pier Avenue	SHORNCLIFFE	Kate Street (from Friday Street to Sunday Street, now Park Parade) was renamed Pier Avenue in 1913. Kate Street (from Barton Street to Friday Street) appears on an 1919 street map as Lower Kate Street but simply as Kate Street in a 1931 street directory. Presumably with the renaming of the more elevated part of the street to Pier Avenue, the use of "lower" became unnecessary.
Playford Street	BRACKEN RIDGE	Previously Mary Street. Renamed in 1938 . Although Playford Street appears in the 1948 street directory, this area is not covered by the 1938 street directory, so I am unable to confirm that it was originally called <u>Mary Street</u> .
Queens Pde	BRIGHTON	Previously Government Road North
Queens Road	BANYO	<i>This area is now an industrial estate.</i>
Range Av	BRIGHTON	Previously Nineteenth Avenue West, West of Beaconsfield Terrace
Regency St	BRIGHTON	Previously Albert Street
Reneham Street	CRIBB ISLAND	Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
Rignold Street (gone)	BANYO	Previously called Queen Street Banyo. Renamed in 1938 [source][source]. Some time after 1956 the streets in this area have been replaced by large industrial estates.
Rodway Street	ZILLMERE	Previously called Third Avenue. Renamed in 1938 [source][source] and confirmed by comparison of the 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Rowell Street	ZILLMERE	Too many First Avenues in Brisbane. Renamed 1938 [source][source] and confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Royal Parade	BANYO	Royal Parade used to be on both sides of the railway line, but the eastern side was absorbed into large industrials estates.
Sandgate Street	DEAGON	Renamed Bungama Street. It may also have bee known as Sandgate Avenue.
Saul St	BRIGHTON	Previously Hunter Street
Seaview St	BRIGHTON	Previously Sea Street
Second Av	SANDGATE	Previously Wilson Street In 1913, the council renamed Petty, Wilson, Cooksley, Jane, Slaughter Henry, and Tully streets to be First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth Sixth and Seventh Avenues respectively.
Second Street	CRIBB ISLAND	Appears on 1956 map but not on current maps as the entire suburb of Cribb Island and parts of Lower Nudgee were subsumed into Brisbane Airport around 1970.
Seventeenth Av	BRIGHTON	Previously Moreton Street

Seventh Av	SANDGATE	Previously Tully Street. In 1913 Petty, Wilson, Cooksley, Jane, Slaughter, Henry and Tully were renamed First, Second, Third, Fourth Fifth , Sixth and Seventh Avenues respectively.
Shepherd St	BRIGHTON	Previously Musgrave Street from Beaconsfield Terrace to Bayview Street. The part from Beaconsfield Terrace to Flinders Parade was renamed Sixteenth Avenue.
Sixteenth Av	BRIGHTON	Previously Musgrave Street from Flinders Parade to Beaconsfields Terrace
Sixth Avenue	SANDGATE	Previously Henry Street. In 1913 Petty, Wilson, Cooksley, Jane, Slaughter, Henry and Tully were renamed First, Second, Third, Fourth Fifth , Sixth and Seventh Avenues respectively.
Slaughter Street	SANDGATE	Renamed Fifth Avenue.
Somers Street	NUDGEE	Previously called William Street. Renamed in 1938 [source][source] and confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.
South End	SHORNCLIFFE	Renamed as part of Allpass Parade.
Speight St	BRIGHTON	Previously Wellington Road
Station Street	BANYO	Renamed Kennaway Street.

Thirteenth Av	BRIGHTON	Previously Paige Street
Todd St	SHORNCLIFFE	Previously Toad Street Street directories in 1917 and 1919 show this street (both on the maps and in the index) as Toad Street. A 1931 street directory calls it Toad Street on the map but Todd Street in the index. In 1938 the street directory calls it Toad Street on both the map and index. In 1948 onwards it appears as Todd Street.
Towner Street	SANDGATE	Renamed before 1939, probably in 1938 when 11 Ann Streets were renamed. It appears as Ann Street in a 1938 street directory but as Towner Street in a 1948 street directory.
Townsend St	BRIGHTON	Government Road Northeast To Brighton Terrace then Fifteenth Avenue to Flinders Parade
Tully Street	SANDGATE	Renamed Seventh Avenue.
Twamley Street	SHORNCLIFFE	Was Ward or Zahel
Twelfth Av	BRIGHTON	Previously Bay Crescent it was renamed Twelfth Avenue from Flinders Pde to Brighton Tce, Gladstone St from Brighton Tce to Speight St, the remainder Paul St
Verney Street	SANDGATE	Appears as Short Street in the 1919 street directory but as Verney Street in the 1931 street directory. Not to be confused with another Short Street in Sandgate (see immediately below) nor the Short Street in Deagon (see above).
Wakefield St	SANDGATE	Part from Brighton Terrace to Flinders Parade renamed Ninth Avenue
Ward St	SANDGATE	Previously Government Road South-east. The section To Brighton Terrace became Ward Street then Tenth Avenue from Brighton Terrace to Flinders Parade



Wharf St	SHORNCLIFFE	Is this possibly part of the original Wharf Street that was renamed Alpass Parade?
White Street	SANDGATE	Originally off Curlew Street but was subsumed into Curlew Park along with Benjamin Street.
Wickham St	BRIGHTON	?
William Street	NUDGE	Renamed Somers Street Nudgee
William Street	SHORNCLIFFE	Renamed Ashford Street Shorncliffe
Wilson Street	SANDGATE	Renamed Second Avenue.
Wimble Street	DEAGON	Emily Street The part west of the railway line. It is still Emily St to the east of the line.
Windeyer Street	BALD HILLS	Previously called Mary Street. Renamed in 1938 and confirmed by comparison of 1938 and 1948 street directories.
Yaldwyn Street	DEAGON	Renamed in 1938 The area is not covered by the 1938 street directory, but Yaldwyn Street appears in the 1948 and 1956 street directories. However, at some time after that, it disappeared, apparently subsumed into parkland. Not to be confused with the two Short Streets in Sandgate.
